I'll do that by showing up, asking questions, listening to concerns, and making decisions that reflect the values of the people who live here. I'm not afraid to speak up and speak my mind, and I'll always put students and families first.

voters use to evaluate you?

Success in this role means our schools are doing right by kids and families. That means students are learning and growing, parents feel included and informed, and the district is open and honest with the community.

Voters can hold me accountable by watching if I'm actually doing what I said I would—speaking up, asking tough questions, keeping things transparent, and always putting students first. If you feel more heard, more informed, and see the focus shift back to solid academics, then I'm doing what I came here to do.

What community activities are you engaged in? Have you held leadership roles in any of these organizations?

I've always made it a priority to stay involved in our community, both personally and professionally. I'm a volunteer firefighter EMT with Airway Heights Fire Department, and part of that role includes leading public education efforts. I regularly work with schools and community groups to teach fire safety, CPR, and emergency preparedness to kids and families.

Alongside that, I've partnered with local elementary schools and the Police Department to organize a Giving Tree program through our restaurant, Wolffy's, which provides holiday gifts for families in need. We also support youth sports, school events, and fundraisers whenever we can.

While I haven't held official titles in these roles, I've taken the lead in organizing, showing up, and doing the behind-the-scenes work that keeps these efforts going. For me, leadership is about taking initiative and giving back to the people around you.

Your Political Beliefs

Anytime our rights are restricted, it should be questioned, challenged, and carefully weighed. unfortunately we saw the opposite of that during Covid, My husband and I as business owners chose to take a very strong stance during that time. Freedom and individual liberty are foundational to who we are as a country, and they should never be taken lightly.

Do you consider yourself a constitutional originalist or do you prescribe to it as a living document? Please explain.

I consider myself more of a constitutional originalist. I believe the Constitution was written with clear intent and timeless principles that should guide how we interpret laws and protect rights today. With that being said, times have changed. We have more modern challenges. That does not mean we get to twist and change things to fit trends or personal agendas. There are checks and balances in place for a reason and our founding fathers gave us the framework to work through the system to amend things when the time came to do so.

In short, I think the Constitution says what it means and means what it says — and it's our job to uphold it, not rewrite it completely.

What is the purpose of government? If elected, how will you perform your duties based on that "purpose?"

The purpose of government is to protect our rights, serve the people, and support families. It's not about control — it's about making sure things run fairly, safely, and in a way that reflects the values of the people.

If I'm elected, I'll carry out my duties by always remembering who I'm there to represent: I plan to speak up and ask the tough questions, push for action, and always remain focused on keeping our schools focused on the right things.

When does life begin and at what point does the government have a duty to protect it?

I'm a Republican, but I don't fit into a perfect political box. I personally believe in limited government, strong families, and individual freedoms — and that includes trusting women to make their own decisions when it comes to pregnancy.

Abortion is a deeply personal and complex issue. I don't take it lightly. But I also don't believe it's the government's role to make that decision for someone. I do believe that abortion has become a scapegoat and excuse for individuals to continue to make poor decisions and never have to live with the consequences of those actions. But, like anything it's a case by case basis and not everyone is abusing the system.
