The deadline is less than a month away and we need everybody engaged and committed to gathering at least 40 signatures.

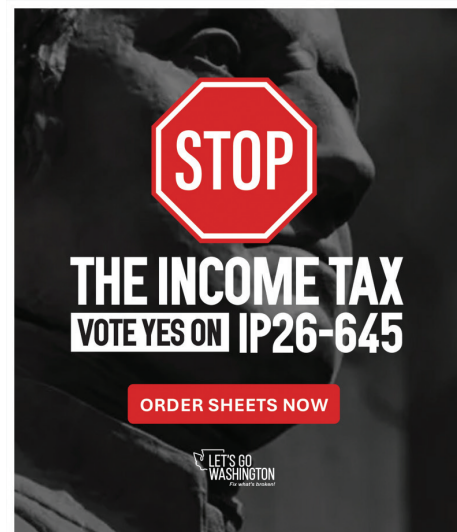
Many of the best signature gathering locations start with a simple conversation.

The Future of the Republican Party Depends on Mentorship

According to FairVote, young people are significantly less likely to vote than older generations. Citizens between the ages of 18 and 29 consistently turn out at rates more than ten points lower than voters over 30. Too often, we talk about this statistic with frustration, but frustration alone will not build the future of the Republican Party. Young people must be invited.

Last month, I wrote about what I wish older conservatives understood about Gen Z. The next question is how we are to rally my generation?

Some organizations (you could probably name a few) are already doing this well through youth outreach, volunteer programs, internships, and community involvement. The problem is that many young people simply do not know these opportunities exist. I did not know about opportunities in Washington until this year, when I found them through the Lincoln Day speech contest.

If Gen Z is craving connection, then relationships are the best way to engage them:

First, meet Gen Z where they already are. Volunteer in youth ministry, local nonprofits, schools, or community organizations. Many of these groups struggle to keep volunteers after college and beyond, which leaves younger people without consistent mentorship from older adults.

Second, invite Gen Z personally. It has been so meaningful to me that I have been invited into Republican spaces! Invite young people to events. Ask them to coffee. Invest in them personally. Most young people will respond far more to relationships than to political messaging. When you live out strong values with consistency and integrity, young people notice. They want examples worth following.

Finally, include Gen Z in meaningful ways. Do not treat them like background decoration for campaign photos but instead give them responsibility. Encourage them to organize events, volunteer, speak up, and contribute ideas. If they feel genuinely valued, many of them will eagerly step forward.

The future of the Republican Party will be built through mentorship, relationships, and strong, Republican men and women willing to invite young people into meaningful community and responsibility

The Time to Stop Corruption and Tyranny is Now

The Founding Fathers were deeply concerned that holding public office, while necessary for governance, could easily become a pathway to corruption, injustice, and tyranny if not carefully restrained. Their warnings were rooted in a sober understanding of human nature: that power, once acquired, tends to expand and be misused.

James Madison, often called the “Father of the Constitution,” argued that government itself reflects human imperfection. Because “men are not angels,” those entrusted with authority must be checked and balanced by competing powers. He warned that “the accumulation of all powers... in the same hands... may justly be pronounced the very definition of

tyranny,” and insisted that “ambition must be made to counteract ambition” to prevent abuse. This insight led directly to the constitutional system of separated powers, designed to restrain officials from overreaching.

George Washington, in his 1796 Farewell Address, emphasized the dangers of self-interest once in office. He cautioned that political factions could substitute the will of a few for the will of the people, undermining public trust and opening the door to domination. He stressed that leaders must prioritize the common good over personal or partisan ambition, or risk eroding the republic from within.

Thomas Jefferson expressed perhaps the starkest warning: that even elected governments could devolve into “elective despotism” if power became concentrated and unaccountable. He observed that individuals in office might “make interested uses of every right and power” and that corruption could spread from leaders into society itself. Jefferson also warned that “the time to guard against corruption and tyranny is before they shall have gotten hold of us,” underscoring the need for vigilance.

John Adams similarly emphasized the moral danger inherent in office, stating that because power corrupts, greater authority demands greater character and accountability. Without virtue and an informed citizenry, even well-designed institutions could decay into injustice.

Taken together, the Founders’ warnings reveal a consistent theme: public office is a trust, not a privilege. Without strong institutions, civic virtue, and public oversight, the trappings of power—prestige, authority, and influence—can easily corrupt leaders and threaten liberty itself.

Patriot Tina Peters is Finally Free

Tina Peters, the former Mesa County, Colorado Clerk walked out of prison on June 1, 2026, after spending 606 days behind bars for performing her sworn duty

Tina had been serving a nine year sentence after a 2024 conviction tied to a 2021 breach of election system security. Prosecutors said she allowed unauthorized access to county voting equipment, leading to copies of election data being shared publicly. However, Tina's supporters and allies have long argued that her actions were motivated by a desire to preserve

election records and investigate concerns about the 2020 election, not to undermine the system.

Her case drew national attention, with supporters portraying her as a whistleblower punished for questioning election integrity. The situation escalated politically, with then former President Donald Trump publicly advocating for her release and calling her a victim of unfair treatment.

In April 2026, a Colorado appeals court upheld Peters' conviction but ruled that her original sentence had been improperly influenced by her protected political speech, ordering a new sentencing process. This decision became a turning point. The following month, Democrat Governor Jared Polis commuted her sentence, reducing it significantly and making her eligible for parole.

Polis stated that while Peters committed a crime and deserved punishment, her sentence had been unusually long for a first time, nonviolent offender. Supporters seized on that acknowledgment as evidence that the justice system had treated her too harshly.

Tina's release has reignited debate nationwide. Critics maintain her actions jeopardized election security, but we see her as a symbol of resistance against government corruption and judicial overreach.

Our prayer for Tina Peters and her family:

“Heavenly Father, be near to those who suffer injustice and persecution; protect them, strengthen their hearts, and bring truth, justice, and peace into their lives. Amen.”



IP26-645
